This award reinforces children following school expectations in our playground and places value on books as a reward.



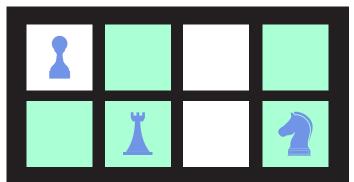


Despite mentioning it in the last newsletter we still have lots of children arriving late to school. Please whānau make it your priority to ensure your child gets to school

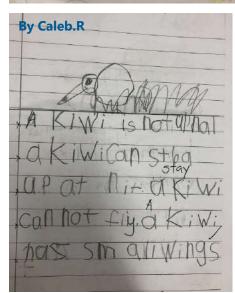


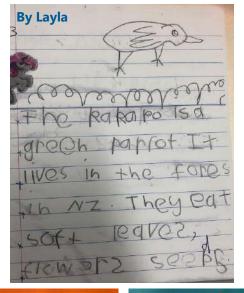




































Photos never are as good as seeing the children's work in real life. I encourage you to have a look around at the displays in classes and learning spaces when you're next at school (if you haven't already).

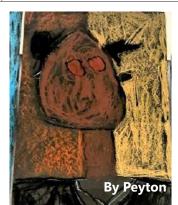

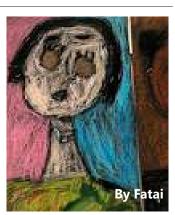
