Last week was a special week for our tamariki and kura celebrating Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori. We had a whole week dedicated to celebrating te reo by incorporating more into our school day. Although these seven days in Mahuru (September) are when we and all of Aotearoa are encouraged to speak Māori we do agree that our wero to ourselves needs to be that we carry this on well beyond Ratapu (Sunday).

Te Wiki o Te Reo Māori was established in 1975 to uplift and celebrate speaking Māori—and this year we celebrated 50 years since the Government was petitioned to formally recognise the language. While people gathered at parliament our tamariki, kaiako and staff gathered in Broadway (our hall) to mark the moment with waiata, learning about Aotearoa's past when te reo Māori wasn't respected by many so we can ensure we don't make the same mistakes.

At Kahurangi we want our tamariki, whānau and everyone connected to our kura to know that we deeply value all things Māori and we aspire to this being visible in every aspect of school life. This is a massive challenge but whānau we're up for it! We're also very grateful for te wiki o te reo Māori because it has helped us refocus and renew this committment.










WHAT DO YOU THINK are the three most important health topics we should teach the children who attend Kahurangi School?



Some of the health topics we've taught over the past few years include:


Pedal ready - learning to bike and scooter Huff 'n' puff - an active soul is a healthy soul
