Some significant building works are soon to start

We finally have a few building projects that are about to get underway in a few weeks. These have been in the planning stages since 2019.

We are starting with all the northern side ground level windows and doors in Waka Rimu (our junior block) being replaced. The current windows are inadequate as they easily get stuck and are hard to open, along with being too heavy for the frames.

Each of these classes (that learn with Emma, Julia, Amy, Judy and Ruth) will need to spend 1-2 weeks in Broadway (our school hall) while the windows are being replaced. We know this isn't ideal but the long term win of having new working windows makes this worthwhile. We're also choosing a time the children feel very settled and will more easily cope with this short disruption.

"Puts us on track to become better employees." Quinn

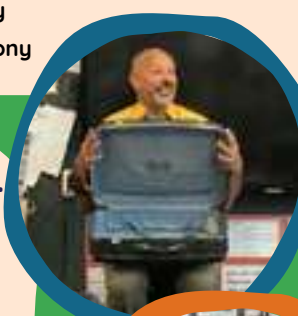
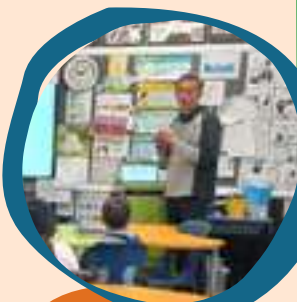
"It helps us understand what jobs are really like. For example, people think architects design houses when actually they draw charts and do paperwork with just a little bit of house designing involved." Mackenzie
