Welcome to the inaugural school newsletter of 2024! We extend a warm welcome to all members of our school community, both familiar faces and those joining us for the first time. A special greeting goes out to the new ākongā (students), whānau (families), and kaiako (teachers) who have become part of the Kahurangi family.

As we kick off the year, we have 255 pupils spread across 12 classes. We anticipate this number to grow to approximately 280 as new 5 year olds join.

At Kahurangi School, our guiding principles - Learning, Pride, Culture, and Community - shape our approach to education. In the coming weeks, our dedicated kaiako (teachers) will immerse our tamariki (children) in these principles, helping them understand the significance of each in their daily school lives and why they are integral to our kura (school).

Our kaiako will also focus on three key areas within their classes:

- 1. Establishing a sense of community, ensuring each child feels safe.
- 2. Setting clear expectations and routines.
- Gaining deeper insight into each child's individuality, understanding how they learn best, their strengths, and areas of challenge.

Throughout the year, you can expect to receive newsletters every three weeks, typically on Fridays. These updates will keep you informed about school events, explain our approaches, share curriculum highlights, showcase our tamariki's achievements, and provide community news. Newsletters are sent via email to whānau and school supporters, with a hard copy given out to students, as we know they like to read it too. If you haven't received the newsletter via email, please update your email address with our office team.

Recognising the crucial role whanau plays in supporting their tamariki's success, we appreciate the positive impact already evident in how well our ākongā (learners) have settled into school these past few days. Conversations about the importance of school, family expectations, and the values of being a good person and showing respect to peers and staff are invaluable. These discussions truly make a difference, as no child wishes to disappoint their parents and whanau.

In closing, regardless of what 2024 may bring, I have full confidence that collectively, as students, parents, whanau, teachers, and support staff, we can all achieve success by believing in and supporting each other!
