At Kahurangi we have the belief that homework doesn't really help our tamariki learn better, and research supports this. Instead, we prefer our tamariki be involved in after school activities such as sport or specialist classes (such as music or art lessons) or involved in completing home chores or even just relaxing, which are all things that are nurturing of their interests beyond the confines of the classroom.

Furthermore, we strongly believe that the demands of a full day's learning (4.5 hours of class learning time), represent a significant day's effort for our tamariki. We also understand that our tamariki need time for relaxation, play, and family. We also believe that fostering a healthy work-life balance from a young age sets them up right for their future. It also helps them grow essential life skills such as time management, selfcare, and interpersonal relationships with their friends!

With all that said, we're huge advocates of kindling a passion for reading in our tamariki. We cannot emphasise enough the importance of urging whānau to prioritise reading as a very important activity at home and to ensure their children do so daily. Whether it's the child reading a school text aloud to you, delving into the pages of a library book, being read to by you, or indulging in extra reading time before bedtime, fostering a habit of reading is immensely important in nurturing a lifelong and capable learner.

Our 'Cellphone Use' policy has been updated

In line with a government directive, we have updated our cellphone use policy. To be honest nothing has changed except for clearer messaging around the use of devices such as smart watches.



The key points of our policy are as follows:

- Cellphones cannot be used during the school day.
- Rules are communicated to our senior school pupils regularly.
- Urgent parent contact during the day should be made through the office.
- If brought, cellphones are handed in at the beginning of the school day and locked up in a class lock box until home time.
- The school does not take responsibility for lost or damaged devices.
- Use results in confiscation and parental contact.
- Inappropriate use includes
 - unauthorised usage,
 - bullying,
 - taking unauthorised photos and videos, and sharing inappropriate content.
