Our Step Up Education Outside the Classroom (EOTC) programme for 2025 is now underway, and it's been wonderful to see our senior tamariki out learning, exploring, and taking on new challenges beyond the classroom.

Step Up is a special part of life at Kahurangi. Every two years our Year 4–8 students have the chance to experience a wide range of activities designed to support their growth — building resilience, confidence, and teamwork, while deepening their connection to our local places and people. These opportunities encourage tamariki to see themselves in new ways and to discover strengths that don't always show up in day-to-day classroom learning.

What often goes unseen, however, is the huge amount of mahi that sits behind these experiences. Step Up requires months of preparation. Our senior teachers put in an incredible amount of work to bring it to life — from writing detailed RAMs, coordinating with providers, and managing logistics, to leading the trips themselves. Alongside them, other staff have stepped up by covering classes, helping with comms, attending trips when needed, helping with organisation and keeping school life ticking over when staff are out. It really is a team effort, and together their collective mahi ensures our children can take part in a rich, well-planned programme that creates both powerful learning and special memories.

Thank you also to the whānau who have stepped up to help with supervision. Your involvement makes these trips not only possible, but richer for the connections and support you bring.








Lost Property Clear Out
