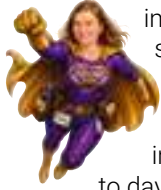


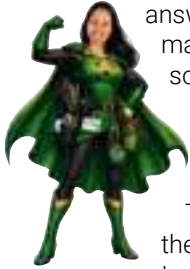


## Support Staff Superheroes

As some of you will know, there are big and significant changes happening across education in Aotearoa, including changes to curriculum, assessment and the way schools report progress to whānau.

Here at Kahurangi, we're currently carefully working through these changes, to help shape what our new student reports will look like moving forward.

To be honest, there's still a lot evolving nationally, and information is very slow coming and not always there, despite the minister of Education saying it is.

Once the design and format are finalised, our kaiako will then begin the big job of writing reports for every tamaiti.

All going well, we're still hopeful reports will still be sent out by the end of the term. One important change we can confirm now is that reports will be sent electronically rather than printed and sent home.

- Choose notification settings





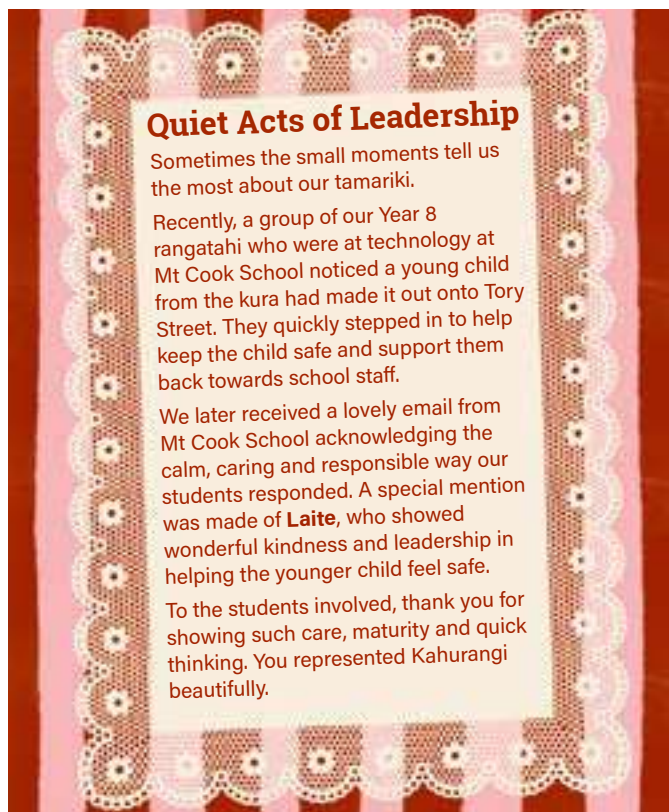
